Our **Year 5** pupils had a fantastic day exploring **Exeter Museum**, where they delved into history and discovered fascinating artefacts from across the ages. Meanwhile, **Year 2** stepped back in time aboard **The Golden Hind** in Brixham, learning what life was like for explorers on the high seas! They also enjoyed a visit to **Brixham Library**, where they met the librarians and explored both fiction and no-fiction quality texts linked to their class learning.





Next week promises to be just as busy and exciting — **Year 1** and **Year 6** are heading to **Paignton Zoo** to learn all about animals and their habitats, and **Year 3** will be turning into budding **geologists** at **Fairy Cove**, studying the incredible rock formations right on our doorstep.

We are so lucky to live within **The English Riviera UNESCO Global Geopark** — one of only **seven geoparks in the UK**. Our coastline is world-famous for its unique geology, telling a story that spans over **400 million years**. From ancient coral reefs to folded red sandstone cliffs, this area gives our pupils a truly special opportunity to see science and geography come alive in real life.

It's important to remember that **Paignton Zoo**, one of our much-loved local landmarks, is currently facing financial challenges. As a school, we are proud to be doing our bit to support them through our visits and thank you, as parents, for supporting this — helping to ensure that future generations can continue to learn from this wonderful place. It would be such a loss for our area if it were to close.

Sporting success has also been on the agenda this term! **Year 2 and Year 4** represented Sacred Heart brilliantly at recent **Paignton Academy Rugby Festivals** held at **Paignton Rugby Club**, joining other local primary schools in a celebration of teamwork, fitness and fun.

Well done to all our pupils for representing Sacred Heart so beautifully in the wider community — learning, exploring and showing our Gospel values wherever they go!

A Real Joy — Live Music at Sacred Heart!



On Monday morning, every child at Sacred Heart had the opportunity to take part in a music workshop led by two local, very talented musicians. We were fortunate to secure an Arts Grant to fund this exciting experience, helping us to enrich our music curriculum and bring the joy of live performance into school.

The workshop was full of energy and smiles — children were able to sing, clap, dance, chant and play instruments, while also listening to music performed live

on a variety of instruments. Experiences like this help children to develop their musical understanding through listening and appraising, exploring rhythm, pitch and tempo, and expressing themselves creatively through movement and song.

We will continue to work closely with our pupil voice groups and lunchtime staff to make sure that lunchtimes remain calm, active and positive for **everyone**. It's wonderful to see our children showing kindness, teamwork and respect during their play — truly living out our Sacred Heart values.



As part of our ongoing focus on creating **positive and purposeful lunchtimes**, our **lunchtime staff** will be taking part in further **Continuing Professional Development (CPD)** next half term. This training will help to strengthen the team's confidence and skills in promoting **positive play**, **teamwork and inclusion**, ensuring that every child enjoys a happy and harmonious lunchtime experience.

The sessions will focus on **building strong relationships**, **supporting purposeful play across our zoned areas**, and encouraging children to take responsibility for their behaviour and choices.

Our lunchtime team play such an important role in school life, and this professional learning will help ensure that lunchtimes continue to be a time of **joy**, **friendship and wellbeing for all**.


