Primary Science Quality Mark (PSQM)

Sacred Heart Achieves the Primary Science Quality Mark!

We are delighted to announce that Sacred Heart Catholic Primary School has been awarded the Primary Science Quality Mark (PSQM) — a nationally recognised award celebrating excellence in science teaching and learning. The award is valid **from 2025 to 2028** and recognises the school's strong commitment to developing an inspiring, inclusive, and high-quality science curriculum for all pupils.

Our science leader, Mrs Alice Whitmore, has worked with exceptional dedication to raise the profile of science across the school. The PSQM reviewers described their leadership as "highly effective, with impressive impact on the science curriculum for the benefit of all pupils."

The review highlighted that:

- The science development log showed a "full cycle of development" with clear links between monitoring, staff training, and improved classroom practice.
- Every child could talk confidently about their learning and name an investigation they had completed — showing that science is engaging, meaningful, and memorable.
- The new Plymouth Science Scheme has made lessons more practical, hands-on, and accessible for all learners, including those with additional needs.
- Links between science, maths, and other subjects are now firmly embedded, helping children apply their learning in a range of contexts.
- Assessment in science is now "a purposeful part of learning," empowering teachers to respond to pupils' needs in the moment.

The reviewers described the overall impact of the PSQM year as "remarkable" and praised the leadership and enthusiasm of Mrs Whitmore, noting that teachers now actively seek her support and that pupils have become more confident, curious, and willing to take risks in their learning.

This achievement reflects the hard work of our whole school community — staff, pupils, and parents — in making science a joyful, inclusive, and inspiring part of everyday learning.

Congratulations to everyone at Sacred Heart for this fantastic recognition of excellence in science!

Sacred Heart Choir

We're delighted to share that **Mrs Good** is restarting our **school choir on Wednesday 19**th **November.** This is open to all **Key Stage 2 pupils** who love to sing!

The choir will meet every Wednesday from 3:15 pm to 4:15 pm with places limited to 30 children. They will be offered on a first come, first served basis. A google form will be send out at 4pm on Monday 10th November. The first 30 to reply will gain



the places. Any forms received after that will be placed on an ordered waiting list.

Being part of the choir is a wonderful way for pupils to develop confidence, teamwork, and a love of music — but it also requires a regular commitment. Children who are offered a place will be expected to attend each week and participate with enthusiasm.

Please note that the choir is **not a childcare provision**. If a child shows that they do not wish to take part or that they are struggling in the after school sessions, this will be discussed with parents and their place will be offered to another pupil who is keen to join. Equally, if a child joins the choir and finds that it is not for them, parents can let school know and the waiting list will be used.

From time to time, choir members may also be invited to perform at **school or community events outside school hours** — a fantastic opportunity to share their talents!

We can't wait to hear our choir singing together again and filling the school with joyful music!



School Council Elections 2025

We're very excited to announce the launch of our new School Council at Sacred Heart!

As part of UK Parliament Week, pupils will be learning about democracy and having their say through real elections in school.

The School Council launch will take place on Friday 14th November. Children who are interested in becoming a councillor will then have just over a week to prepare a **manifesto poster** explaining why they would make a great class representative.

Key Dates:

- Friday 14th November School Council launch
- Monday 24th November Closing date for manifesto posters (the start of UK Parliament Week)
- Monday 24th Thursday 27th November Candidates will present their manifesto posters to their class
- Friday 28th November Election Day! Each class will take part in a secret ballot to vote for their councillors

Every class from Year 2 to Year 6 will elect their own representatives, and an additional six pupils from Year 6 will be chosen to represent Nursery, Reception and Year 1.

Following the counting of the votes, the newly formed School Council will be led by Miss Hartley, PSHE Lead. The newly formed council will meet monthly to share pupil ideas, discuss ways to improve our school, and plan projects that make a difference to school life and our wider community.

This is a brilliant opportunity for children to learn about leadership, teamwork, and having a voice in school life. We can't wait to see the enthusiasm and creativity of our campaign posters.

Webinar: Understanding the Balanced System

They will work with the school team and consult with them regularly to identify needs so that all children and young people access the right support at the right time in their learning context.

These sessions will offer an opportunity to:

- Learn more about how the Balanced System® Link Therapist Model works
- Ask questions and find out how CFHD Speech and Language Therapists will be supporting your child's speech, language and communication needs within schools

Each session will be tailored to your local area, so you can find out what's happening near you and connect with local support networks.
